

Brooklyn Connections proposed changes

Wellington City Council is consulting on an updated design for Brooklyn Connections, a project focused on improving safety and access for people walking, biking, catching the bus and driving between Brooklyn and the city.

We're now seeking community feedback on these proposed changes until 5pm, 3 August 2026.

Brooklyn Connections is a project to upgrade the existing trial cycleway installed in 2021 to a permanent cycleway. The project replaces the current plastic separators with lower-profile concrete islands and painted cycleway buffers, alongside safer pedestrian crossings and bus stop improvements.

The project forms part of Wellington's wider transport network improvements. This route is an important connection for commuters, public transport, freight, schools, and local communities.

Since the project was originally approved in 2023, both funding and project priorities have changed. NZTA withdrew its 51% co-investment contribution, and funding for Wellington City Council's Bike Network programme was reduced.

In response, the project was redesigned to deliver key safety and transport benefits at a lower cost.

The updated 2026 design builds on what was already agreed but is smaller in scale. It still aims to deliver most of the original benefits – around 80% – while costing less than half as much to build.

Brooklyn Connections

The Brooklyn Connections project proposes changes in Brooklyn Road, Ohiro Road and Helen Street.



Brooklyn Road

- A permanent, continuous protected cycle lane will be painted on the uphill side of Brooklyn road, starting at the bottom at the intersection of Nairn Street and Brooklyn Road, continuing up and onto Ohiro Road, ending outside 159A Ohiro road.
- Concrete separators installed to separate the cycle lane from the road
- A new bus stop island at the intersection of Bidwill Street and Brooklyn Road.
- Bus stop 6716 (near Washington Ave/Brooklyn Rd) will be reduced in size from 21 metres to 15 metres.
- Some short sections of shared path will be removed and changed to dedicated cycle lanes. These would be:
 - Outside 21 Brooklyn Road (13.2 metres)
 - Outside 25 Brooklyn Road (11.1 metres)
- Brooklyn Road (northbound) – 8 spaces removed opposite numbers 8-10.

Ohiro Road

- A new northbound (towards the city) cycle lane will be installed on the western side of Ohiro Road, starting near the Todman Street / Cleveland Street intersection and continuing to a new pedestrian crossing just before Brooklyn Road.
- Bus stop 7718 (opposite Bretby Crescent) will be reduced in size from 25 metres to 15 metres.
- Bus stop 6719 (outside 185 Ohiro Rd) will be removed.
- Bus stop 6718 (currently outside 159A Ohiro Rd) will be relocated to outside 171 Ohiro Rd.
- A new flush (road-level) zebra crossing will be installed outside 143 Ohiro Road at the existing median refuge crossing.
- Ohiro Road (southbound) – 4 spaces removed near numbers 169-175.
- Ohiro Road (northbound) – 20 spaces removed near number 16.
- Ohiro Road - 5 spaces removed north of Tanera Crescent.

Helen Street

To offset the removal of the carparks on Brooklyn Road and Ohiro Road, additional parking will be added in Helen Street, increasing the number of carparks from 15 parallel spaces to 33 angled spaces.

Proposed changes on Brooklyn Road

Changes proposed on Brooklyn Road are:

- Paint a permanent protected cycle lane on the uphill side of Brooklyn Road.
- Install a new bus stop island at the intersection of Bidwill Street and Brooklyn Road.
- Replace the plastic separators with concrete low-lying horizontal separators.
- Shorten the bus stop 6716 (near Washington Ave/Brooklyn Rd).
- Change short sections of the shared path (near Washington Ave/Brooklyn Rd) into a cycle lane.
- Permanently remove 8 parallel parking spaces on the downhill side of Brooklyn Road.

Proposed changes on Ohiro Road

Between Brooklyn Road/Ohiro Road and the traffic lights at Todman/Cleveland Street, we are proposing to:

- Install cycle lanes on both sides of Ohiro Road up to the traffic lights.
- Remove one bus stop to help improve space and visibility.
- Relocate another bus stop nearby to a new position.
- Permanently remove 4 parking spaces on eastern side of the road heading towards the shops.
- Permanently remove 25 parking spaces on the western side of the road heading towards the city centre.
- Install a new flush (road level) pedestrian crossing, where the existing pedestrian refuge is currently outside 143 Ohiro Road.

- Install 33 new angle carparks, meaning an additional 18 carparks will be available overall to use for public parking on Helen Street.
